19729. CHAIRMAN'S COMMUNICATIONS

19730. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

19731. THE CONTEXT OF THE LOCAL TRANSPORT PLAN

The Clerk outlined the development, funding and implementation of the Town Plan that was now reaching its conclusion. The Chairman of the Town Plan & Infrastructure Committee had identified promoting sustainable transport to accommodate future growth, stemming from Dacorum Borough Council's Single Local Plan, as the priority of the next phase of the Town Plan.

The objective was to develop a supplementary planning document by working in partnership with the local parishes, district and county councils, and other stakeholders via the new rail franchisee (London Northwestern Railway)'s Local Station initiative.

19732. THE LOCAL STATION PLAN: TO REVIEW THE STATUS OF THE PROJECT

The Clerk explained the background to the new rail franchisee (London Northwestern Railway)'s Local Station initiative and how an initial scoping meeting had been held with representatives from the surrounding parishes. The next step will be a meeting of all stakeholders – to be arranged.

19733. TERMS OF REFERENCE

Draft terms of reference for the Committee had been circulated prior to the meeting. The number of stakeholders involved in the development of the Local Station Plan, leading onto the Local Transport Plan, precluded that group being a standing committee of the Town Council. The Local Transport Plan Committee was established to provide the strategic input and scrutiny of the development of the plan.

RESOLVED: To approve the draft Terms of Reference as presented, subject to the second paragraph section 2 reading “Non-members may be appointed, but the non-members will have no vote”.

19734. TO CONSIDER POSSIBLE CO-OPTION OF MEMBERS TO THE COMMITTEE

Resolution 19687, passed at the Annual Council Meeting held on Monday 20th May 2019, established the Local Transport Plan Committee with a membership of four councillors plus two non-members. The Committee considered nominations for the two non-members.

RESOLVED: To invite Mrs E. Bendall and Mr H. Grace to join the Committee, subject to ratification by the Council, and to invite Mr. N. Hollinghurst to attend in his role as local County Councillor.
