## ROAD HUMPS NOTICE (DUNDALE ROAD, SILK MILL WAY, WINGRAVE ROAD, BROOK STREET AND GROVE ROAD, TRING) 2024

NOTICE is given that the Hertfordshire County Council in order to improve road safety proposes under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 to introduce a new 20 mph zone, a new 40 mph speed limit and a prohibition and restriction of stopping and waiting on the school keep clear markings in parts of Tring as specified in Schedules 1, 2 and 3 to this Notice.

It is also proposed under sections 90A – 90F of the Highways Act 1980 and in accordance Dundale Road, Silk Mill Way, Wingrave Road, Brook Street and Grove Road, with The Highways (Road Humps) Regulations 1999, to install flat topped road humps and speed cushions in those lengths of Tring as specified in Schedule 4 to this Notice.

### Flat topped road humps

#### **Dundale Road:**

- (a) from a point 11 metres north west of a point in line with the boundary between 94 and 96 Dundale Road north westwards for 8.5 metres
- (b) from a point 5 metres south of a point in line with the boundary between 86 and 88 Dundale Road southwards for 8.5 metres.
- (c) from a point 7 metres south east of a point in line with the boundary between 62 and 64 Dundale Road south eastwards for 8.5 metres.
- (d) from a point 5 metres south east of a point in line with the boundary between 49 and 51 Dundale Road south eastwards for 8.5 metres.

### Silk Mill Wav

- (a) from a point 9.5 metres north west of a point in line with the boundary between 37 and 39 Roseberry Way north westwards for 8.5 metres.
- (b) from a point 11.5 metres north east of a point in line with the north east facia wall of 33 Grenadine Way north eastwards for 8.5 metres.
- (c) from a point 9.5 metres south west of a point in line with the projected south west kerbline of Adams Way south westwards for 8.5 metres.

### Wingrave Road

(a) from a point 47 metres north of a point in line with the projected north kerbline of Silk Mill Way northwards for 8.5 metres.

- (b) from a point 20 metres south of a point in line with the projected south kerbline of Silk Mill Way southwards for 8.5 metres.
- (c) from a point 8 metres north of a point in line with the boundary between 59 and 60 Wingrave Road northwards for 8.5 metres.
- (d) from a point 4 metres south east of a point in line with the boundary between 44 and 45 Wingrave Road south eastwards for 8.5 metres.

#### **Brook Street**

- (a) from a point 4 metres north of a point in line with the north boundary of 1-2 The Steps, Brook Close northwards for 8.5 metres
- (b) from a point 111.5 metres north of a point in line with the north boundary of 1-2 The Steps, Brook Close northwards for 8.5 metres.

The flat topped road humps will be constructed at a height of approximately 65mm above the existing carriageway with on/off gradients of approximately 1:20.

### Speed cushions

#### Grove Road

- (a) centred on a point 8 metres north of a point in line with the boundary between 9 and 15 Grove Road.
- (b) centred on a point 7 metres north west of a point in line with the boundary between 70 and 72 Grove Road.
- (c) centred on a point 7 metres south east of a point in line with the boundary between 80 and 82 Grove Road.
- (d) centred on a point 6 metres south of a point in line with the boundary between 102 and 104 Grove Road.
- (e) centred on a point 10.5 metres north of a point in line with the boundary between 112 and 114 Grove Road.
- (f) centred on a point 13 metres south of a point in line with the boundary between 118 and 120 Grove Road.

The speed cushions to be laid in pairs will be constructed and lit in accordance with The Highways (Road Humps) Regulations 1999 at a height of approximately 65mm above the existing carriageway with on / off gradients of approximately 1:8 and side gradients of approximately 1:5.



- 3. Interpretation -

The Hertfordshire County Council in exercise of their powers under Sections 1, 2 and 3 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (which said Act of 1984 is hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1984"), and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police hereby make the following Order:-

- 1. This Order may be cited as "The Hertfordshire (Mortimer Hill, Tring) (Prohibition and Restriction of Stopping and Waiting) Order 2024" and shall come into effect on ........
- The Hertfordshire (Mortimer Hill, Tring) (Prohibition and Restriction of Stopping and Waiting)
   Order 2024 Plan numbered **D00224 PSKC**, inclusive of its key, as listed in the Schedule to this
   Order is incorporated into this Order.

## 3. Interpretation -

In this Order, except where the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meaning hereby respectively assigned to them;

"disabled person's vehicle" has the same meaning as in Section 142(1) of the Act of 1984;

"disabled person's badge" has the same meaning as given in Regulation 3(1) of The Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000;

"parking disc" has the same meaning as given in Regulation 8(5) of The Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000;

"postal packet" shall bear the same meaning as in Section 65 of the Postal Services Act 2011;

"provision of a universal postal Service" shall bear the same meaning as in Section 65 of the Postal Services Act 2011;

"relevant position" has the same meaning as given in Regulation 4 of The Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000;

"universal service provider" shall bear the same meaning as in Section 65 of the Postal Services Act 2011.

- 4. Save as provided in Articles 5, 6 and 7 of this Order no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to wait on areas of road or sides of the road as shown on plan **D00224 PSKC**, where waiting is not allowed as identified and shown on plan **D00224 PSKC** and its key thereof.
- 5. Nothing in Article 4 of this Order applies in relation to -
  - (a) a vehicle being used for Fire and Rescue, Ambulance or Police purposes.
  - (b) anything done with the permission of or at the direction of a Police Constable in uniform, or with permission of a Civil Enforcement Officer as defined by the Traffic Management Act 2004 and appointed by Dacorum Borough Council.
  - (c) a vehicle which is being used for one or more of the following purposes and which cannot reasonably be used for such a purpose;
    - (i) any operation involving building, demolition or excavation;
    - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;

- (iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of a road;
- (iv) constructing, improving, maintaining, or cleaning of any street furniture; or
- (v) the laying, erection, alteration, repair or cleaning of any sewer or of any main pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity, or of any telecommunications apparatus kept or installed for the purposes of a telecommunications code system or of any other telecommunications apparatus lawfully kept installed in any position.
- (d) a marked vehicle which, whilst used by a universal service provider in the course of the provision of a universal postal service, is waiting only for long as is reasonably necessary to enable postal packets to be delivered or collected.
- 6. The restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restriction or requirement imposed by any other regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act of 1984 or by or under any other enactment.
- 7. The provisions of the following Orders are hereby revoked only in so far as they are affected by the restrictions imposed by this Order:

# ROAD HUMPS NOTICE (DUNDALE ROAD, SILK MILL WAY, WINGRAVE ROAD, BROOK STREET AND GROVE ROAD, TRING) 2024

Hertfordshire County Council is proposing to introduce a new 20mph zone, 40 mph speed limit, waiting restrictions and traffic calming in parts of Tring.

The proposals will comprise of

- 20 mph zone on those lengths of Dundale Road, Nathaniel Walk, Drummond Ride, Manor Road, Bettys Lane, Eight Acres, Meadow Close, St Peters Hill, Faversham Close, Frogmore Street, Lakeside, Icknield Green, New Road, Blaine Close, Morefields, Fields End, Elm Tree Walk, Grenadine Way, Mulberry Close, Adams Way, Gwynne Close, Silk Mill Way, Kingsley Close, Roseberry Way, Chapel Meadow, Long Bridge Close, Bushells Wharf, Elizabeth Drive, Tringford Road, Wingrave Road, Sutton Close, Pheasant Close, Brook Street, Shugars Green, Brookfield Close, Mill Gardens, Plaiters Close, Grove Road, Grove Gardens, Hunters Close, Bunyan Close, Hollyfield, Netherby Close, Hollyfield Close, Marshcroft Lane, Sulgrave Crescent, Beacon Way, Chiltern Way, Danvers Court, Verney Close, Carrington Place, Mortimer Hill, Nursery Gardens, Weston Gardens, Sycamore Drive, Treehanger Close, The Leys, Hawkwell Drive, Hazeley, Harcourt Road, The Beeches, Grove Park, Grange Road, Whytingham Road and New Mill Terrace.
- 40 mph speed limit on part of Tringford Road.
- Prohibition and restriction of stopping and waiting operating 8.00am to 5.00pm Monday to Friday on the School Keep Clear markings on Mortimer Hill outside Tring School.
- Flat topped road humps and speed cushion restrictions on parts of Dundale Road, Silk Mill Way, Wingrave Road, Brook Street and Grove Road.

The local Councillor is funding an extension of the existing Tring 20 mph zone. The proposals will ensure compliance on some roads; traffic calming is to be required. The school keep clear markings outside of Tring School are to match the new layout of the entrance to the school.

Traffic calming features have been located so as not to restrict vehicular access to properties. Parking to be removed outside of Tring School to make safer for students entering and leaving school.

The proposals have been subject to consultation with local and County Councillors representing the area and Dacorum Borough Council. The local Police, Ambulance, Fire & Rescue Services, Hertfordshire County Council Passenger Transport Unit, Tring Town Council and local residents are also being consulted.
